Tickets to individual concerts go on sale on Monday, September 21st at Process 4 circle arts Gallery.

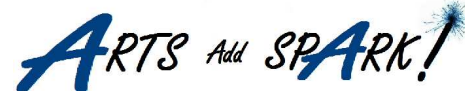
