Stephen Fearing was born in 1963 in Vancouver and grew up in Dublin, where his schoolmates included future members of U2. In 1981, he moved to Minneapolis and immersed himself in the music scene, learning the fundamentals of songwriting and performing while washing dishes to stay alive. By 1984 Stephen was back in Vancouver, determined to become a professional musician. In the years since, he's been named as one of the finest songwriters in Canada and has built a national and international audience for his music. He does it old school, through countless performances at intimate venues and on the concert stages of festivals and theatres across Canada, the US, the UK and Europe. Stephen Fearing's 2017 BC tour will feature his trio, including Gary Craig on drums and John Dymond on bass.

At McGill University, he discovered the dan bau (Vietnamese monochord), tutored by master Pham Duc Trinh. The Huu Bac Quintet now delivers a contemporary dialogue between Asian, North and South American cultures. Huu Bac uses everything in his cultural palette, from the dan bau and Andean flute to jazz guitar, creating a sound that is both familiar and mysterious. Backed by some of the most prominent musicians on the Montreal jazz scene, Huu Bac performs compositions inspired by his travels in Asia, Europe and South America.
